At Stillwater Elementary, the enrichment program focused on building the knowledge of students and fostering their creativity through activities such as makerspace, robotics, cooking, arts and crafts, and book club. On sunny days, students were active outside doing Zumba or playing physical education (PE) games.

Students enrolled in the summer success program worked on refining their knowledge and skills with math games, word searches and art and music. In addition, the district's six week summer learning program provided students aged 5 to 21 with exciting ways to stay involved with their education. It also offered them opportunities to apply lessons learned during the school year through hands-on, real-life experiences. Sometimes, this included weekly trips off campus

to places like the Bring On The Spectrum Community Space & Sensory Gym, mini golf, Fort William Henry, bowling and an aguarium. During a mini golf excursion, students practiced turn taking, frustration tolerance and making friendships. Stillwater High School students were also part of the summer enrichment and learning programs in the elementary and middle/high schools, where they served as activity assistants and worked with their younger schoolmates.

"Mr. Wager brings an abundance of leadership experience to our district, and we're eager to welcome him to our school," said Stillwater Superintendent Patricia Morris.




